<p>What data does this group need to know to be more effective in data-driven decision making?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Data about diversions from hospitals needed. This can be utilized to incentivize buy in from hospital administration. E.g. can show how much money they would save through diversion/reentry measures etc.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Data from the Waco case study includes: Data showing that a 911 mental health case manager (QMHP) can help divert 911 calls to 211 or to other local resources/agencies before the individual comes into contact with 911 responders or police officers responding to the call.
