Mapping The Behavioral Health Care System: Importance And Benefits

- o Identify gaps and areas of improvement within the system
- Enhance collaborations and strategic partnerships between stakeholders
- Secure funding and enable effective allocation of resources
- o Improve access and navigation for individuals seeking help

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Continuum of Care

- Is a system of programs and services that are communitybased and community-oriented
- Assists individuals before, during and after crisis

Stepped Care Approach

- Stepped Care is a system of delivering and monitoring mental health treatment so that the most effective, yet least resourceintensive, treatment is delivered first.
- Only "stepping up" to more intensive, specialized services as required based on the level of patient distress or need.



Stepped Care Mental Health

W	Who is responsible for care?		What is the focus?	What do they do?
	Step 5:	Inpatient care, crisis teams	Risk to life, severe self-neglect	Medication, combined treatments, ECT
S	Step 4:	Mental health specialists, including crisis teams	Treatment-resistant, recurrent, atypical and psychotic depression, and those at significant risk	Medication, complex psychological interventions, combined treatments
Step	3:	Primary care team, primary care mental health worker	Moderate or severe depression	Medication, psychological interventions, social support
Step 2:		Primary care team, primary care mental health worker	Mild depression	Watchful waiting, guided self-help, computerised CBT, exercise, brief psychological interventions
ep 1:		GP, practice nurse	Recognition	Assessment
