## Potter-Randall Sequential Intercept Mapping--Progress Update 11.14.2024

Goals/Objectives to be accomplished:	Since May 2024 Justice Forum, the Potter-Randall SIM priorities and respective groups have agreed to integrate into the PBHA Justice Reentry Workgroup which will focus on the reentry issues from each SIM intercept into the community. PBHA convened and facilitated the Reentry Workshop to identify a new shared consensus on next steps and goal for the group in September and October. We are in the process of streamlining justice related projects as internal and external projects.
Challenges/Issues for progress:	Scope creep will need to be managed to address stakeholders' identification of various aspects of reentry (Justice vs. Hospitals vs. Homelessness vs. Prevention/SDOH) while aligning with PBHA's overarching goal of improving access to care by enhancing continuity of care and systemic coordination for justice-involved individuals with mental illness and substance use issues.
